Arbor Day

“Right tree in the right place” is the motto of Duquesne Light’s Vegetation Management team. As an early commemoration of Arbor Day, nearly 20 Duquesne Light employees volunteered with Tree Pittsburgh to plant 60 trees along the Three Rivers Heritage trail on April 21.

Because trees are one of top causes of power outages, it’s important to plant them in a responsible manner. Before grabbing a shovel, find out how high and wide your tree may grow, and size up the area where you plan to plant it.
