

NIGHTLIGHT SAFETY NOTICE

Attention: Customers Who Received Nightlights from Watt Choices Program in March.

Duquesne Light is dedicated to providing safe electrical energy to homes and businesses in the Pittsburgh area. Your safety is our top priority, and we do our best to keep our customers informed about matters that impact them.

We recently received a safety warning from a third-party vendor related to nightlights distributed by the Watt Choices program at six events in March 2017, including the Watt Choices booth at the 2017 Home & Garden Show at the David L. Lawrence Convention Center. The nightlight distributor, AM Conservation Group, Inc., reported that these nightlights, may be defective and may begin to smoke after several hours of use. The nightlight features an arched front plate (shown below).

While Duquesne Light has not received any customer reports of defective nightlights, in an abundance of caution, we recommend that customers stop using and discard any arched-front nightlights they may have received.

The arched-front nightlights also may have been distributed at the following March events.

- March 2 Food Bank Produce to People event in Sheraden
- March 3 AARP Meeting at the Northside Croatian Club
- March 9 Food Bank Produce to People event in Duquesne
- March 18 Food Bank Produce to People event in McKeesport
- March 28 Senior Ministry at the Calvary Baptist Church in the Hill District

If you received an arched-front nightlight at one of these events and would like to receive a different, replacement nightlight, contact us at 1-800-247-0400. A Watt Choices representative has notified these groups and will attend an event in the near future at all of these locations to provide this notice and a different nightlight.

Please note that any other nightlights received from Duquesne Light are not included in this warning.
